- **✓ Pass FSA Reading Assessment**
- ✓ Maintain a 2.0 <u>Unweighted</u> G.P.A.
- **✓ Complete a Distance Learning Class (FLVS)**
- **✓** Complete a Community Service Project

# **COMMUNITY SERVICE PROJECT**

- ✓ ALL students must complete a Community Service Project before graduation from a Miami-Dade County Public School
- **✓ The project is to be completed between 9th and 12th Grade**
- √ 10 minimum hours are required. DUE DATE: Tuesday, November 22<sup>nd</sup> to your counselor
- **✓** The following programs require a specific number:
  - **✓** Florida Academic Scholars Award 100 hrs.
  - ✓ Florida Academic Medallion Award 75 hrs.
  - **✓** Florida Vocational Gold Seal Award 30 hrs.
- ✓ Community Service Projects must be planned as organized voluntary efforts designed to address real problems or needs in the community
- **✓** Obtain your counselor's signature before beginning
- ✓ Pick up a form in the Guidance Office Room 826
- **✓** School Beautification Project November 4, 2017 from 9am-12pm (Tentative)

- **✓** 10<sup>th</sup> Grade Reading FSA- Must Pass to Graduate
- **✓** Algebra 1 EOC Must Pass to Graduate
- **✓** Geometry EOC 30% of Final Grade
- **✓**Biology EOC 30% of Final Grade
- **✓U.S.** History EOC 30% of Final Grade

## **SCHOLAR DIPLOMA DESIGNATION**

In addition to meeting the standard high school diploma requirements a student must:

- ✓ Earn 1 credit in Algebra II
- ✓ Earn 1 credit in statistics or an equally rigorous mathematics course
- ✓ Pass the Biology 1 EOC
- ✓ Earn 1 credit in chemistry or physics
- ✓ Earn 1 credit in a course equally rigorous to chemistry or physics
- ✓ Pass the U.S. History EOC Assessment
- ✓ Earn 2 credits in the same world language
- ✓ Earn at least 1 credit in AP, IB, AICE or a dual enrollment course

A student is exempt from the Biology I or U.S. History assessment if the student is enrolled in an AP, IB or AICE Biology I or U.S. History course and the student

- ✓ Takes the respective AP, IB or AICE assessment; and
- Earns the minimum score to earn college credit.

## SAT and ACT Test and College Application Fee Waivers

# Students that have <u>free or reduced lunch</u>, qualify for the following:

- ≥ 2 ACT test waivers
- ➤ 2 SAT test fee waivers
- ➤ 2 SAT Subject Test fee waivers Only required by very selective universities (each waiver is good for 3 subject tests)
- ➤ 4 College Board College Application Fee Waivers (<u>These will be available</u> through your College Board account, www.sat.org)
- ➤ 4 ACT College Application Fee Waivers Available from Ms. Orfely
- ➤ Waivers used during junior year count towards the total of 2
- ➤ It might be a good idea to take a picture of the fee waiver number in case you lose it.
